32 Count, 4 Wall Line Dance

Music: Trashy Women by Confederate Railroad

HEEL, CLOSE, HEEL, CLOSE, ANGLED HEELS, FWD HEELS

- 1-2 Tap L heel in front, Step L in place
- 3-4 Tap R heel in front, Step R in place
- 5-6 Tap L heel on left 45 angle twice
- 7-8 Tap L heel forward twice

TOE, HEEL, TOE, HEEL, & HEEL, HIP SWITCH, CLAP

- 9 Touch L toe back on left 45 angle
- 10 Touch L heel forward
- 11 Touch L toe back on left 45 angle
- 12 Touch L heel forward
- & Step L beside R
- 13 Touch R heel forward
- 14 Reach hands out to front and clench fists**
- 15 Pull hands to waist and at the same time push hips forward
- 16 Push fists forward and hips back

1/4 TURN VINE, HITCH, VINE, HITCH

- 17-18 Turning 1/4 left, step R to right, step L behind R
- 19-20 Step R to right, hitch L
- 21-22 Step L to left, step R behind L,
- 23-24 Step L to left, hitch R

WALK BACK, HITCH, FWD-SLIDE-FWD, STOMP

- 25-27 Step back R, L, R
- 28 Hitch L
- 29-30 Step forward on L, slide R next to L
- 31-32 Step forward on L, slide R beside L with weight.

REPEAT

Variation done a lot on 13-16:

- 13 Touch R heel out and put hands out clenching fists
- 14-16 Pull hips forward, push hips back, pull hips forward

Note: These are the steps to this dance as written up in Country Dance Lines (headings and variation added...) Here is the note from the top of the Country Dance Lines page by Dick and Geneva Matteis:

"At the Inn Place where we host our Monday Night C/W Dance party, we recently had visitors from New York who showed us a cute little line dance. They told us the name of the original dance was Pony "Pull", but that they had added some steps which gave it 28 counts. A 32 (or 64) count dance phrases better to most music, and because the dance had already been changed, we added some steps to make it 32 counts. As it was no longer the same dance we changed the name. If you want to see why we call it "Horse'n Around", come by the Inn Place on Mondays or the Rhinestone Cowboy (Tuesday-Saturday), Newport News, VA.
